Abstract	<p>Apparently, the subject of animal names has acquired a special significance throughout reading various texts in various languages, for they are mentioned in the Bible, the New Testament, and the Holy Quran.</p> <p>Those names have played an important role in various human activities, as animals are considered of a high value in man's life.</p> <p>In addition, the Semitic languages had also mentioned animals not only in its various sources and but also in its literary writings, as well.</p> <p>Some peoples, whose Semitic languages constitute one of its characteristic aspects, that is, those which use them in speech, always share similar names of animals. Yet, some of these were employed in different forms.</p> <p>Masculine and feminine names of similar animals, in addition to different names of those animals, occurred. Some of those names have no counterparts in other Semitic languages.</p> <p>Many names of animals which appeared went through phonetic changes, such as phonetic mutuality and names of places.</p>
