The writer should give the best possible description to the reader

The writer should create a sensory image on the reader's mind which paints a picture with words



Descriptive paragraph include details that appeal to the five senses: sight, taste, touch, smell, and hearing

- Before you begin your paragraph, pick something that is worth to describing.
- Let the reader knows what you are describing instead of leaving them guessing.

Space Order

Spatial order shows how people and objects are arranged in a space or a scene. A description can be organized spatially in several ways:

From top to bottom
Outside to inside
Left to right
Near to far
Inside to outside
or the reverse of any of these



You can begin from left to right, from top to bottom,


My Favorite Café
